The directory also needs to be SAFE. Therefore, the listings must pass a blacklist inspection by the State of Florida's Office of Statewide Prosecution. The listings must also adhere to a strict Code of Conduct policy with the acknowledgement that any violation will result in a suspension or permanent removal of the listing (reports against a listing will result in probation until the action has been reviewed). Finally, the listings must be in business at least one year and are encouraged to pursue trauma-informed training and SAFE alliance membership.
